Have you begun another cycle of your program year? CHP has cycles, too: in the summer, we are often limited to the funds that **you**, our congregational bedrock, have sent to us this year.



As summer turned to fall, a family of six, living in a tent, found housing through one of our collaborating agencies. Birth certificates were needed for the entire family: CHP, with **your** funds, funded copies for four family members.

Illness, accident, layoff, and other reasons push people into crisis. Imagine having no water or electricity in hot summer months! We can also pay for birth certificates or IDs for people as they are hired into new jobs or apply for subsidized housing, gas vouchers, bus passes, and prescriptions.



We trust that you will help replenish those funds in the months to come, because we can only use our federal grants for those who qualify for rental or utility assistance. If clients don't qualify for grants, we depend on our congregational funds to help keep their heat and hot water heater and lights on, or the roof staying over a family's head.

As the weather turns wet and chilly, some of our neighbors need gloves, hats, scarves, and warm socks, along with small containers of hand lotion, (and always, toothbrushes and toothpaste).
